

My name is Manuel Porth, formally Manuel Rapaport. I graduated from Cass Technical High School in the class of 1959. I applied to Wayne State University and was accepted to the 1st Monteith class of 1959. I graduated Wayne University with a bachelor of philosophy degree, attended the University of Illinois studying microbiology and virology for one year, and then elected to apply to medical school. I was fortunate enough to get accepted to Wayne University Medical School in 1964, and after four wonderful years at Wayne University Medical School graduated with M.D. degree. I spent two years at the University of Chicago doing general surgery training and was then drafted in the United States Army having received the Berry deferment for two years before entering active duty with the United States Army. I spent two years as Fort Meyer as a partially trained surgeon in Washington DC, one year at Fort Belvoir in general surgery and three additional years in Walter Reed in Washington DC where I received my training in orthopedic surgery.
